

## 7 DAY ITINERARY

## West Coast

## Day 1 – Launceston

Distance and drive time: 30 km – 48 min

- Visit Launceston City Park and stroll through the beautiful gardens
  - Wander around Cataract Gorge and take the world's longest single-span chairlift over the Gorge
  - Take a cruise with Tamar River Cruises and experience the beauty of the region from the water
  - Explore Inveresk or head out to the Tamar Valley past vineyards, orchards, dairies, salmon farms, truffle woods and olive groves – need a location or visit the Tamar Valley Wetlands Reserve
  - Join a walking ghost tour of Launceston after dark
- Overnight Launceston*

## Day 2 – Launceston to Cradle Mountain

Distance and drive time: 155 km – 2 hr 15 min

- See the largest population of endangered Tasmanian devils at Trowunna Wildlife Park or explore the magical world of Tasmazia & The Village of Lower Crackpot
  - Take a Western Wilds journey into the heart of the Cradle Mountain-Lake St Clair National Park and walk the Dove Lake Circuit
- Overnight Cradle Mountain*

## Day 3 – Cradle Mountain to Strahan

Distance and drive time: 140 km – 2 hr

- Visit historic mining town Zeehan and walk through the Spray Tunnel, a 100m long abandoned railway tunnel
  - On to Strahan, take an afternoon River and Rainforest trip on the West Coast Wilderness Railway
  - Watch out for platypus on the short walk to Hogarth Falls in Strahan
  - Drive to Henty Dunes and watch the sunset at Ocean Beach
- Overnight in Strahan*

## Day 4 – Strahan

*Distance and drive time: 4 km – 9 min*

- Take a cruise on the Gordon River into Tasmania's Wilderness World Heritage Area with Gordon River Cruises
- Enjoy Australia's longest running stage performance, The Ship that Never Was, held nightly in Strahan

*Overnight in Strahan*

## Day 5 – Strahan to Hobart

*Distance and drive time: 300 km – 4 hr 35 min*

- Explore historic Queenstown and the western wilderness
- Visit the Wall in the Wilderness, a 100 m long hand carved sculpture on display at Derwent Bridge
- Find unique treasures in New Norfolk's antique stores

*Overnight Hobart*

## Day 6 – Hobart

- Explore Sullivans Cove and Salamanca Market (every Saturday)
- Catch the ferry from Brooke Street Pier to the Museum of Old and New Art – Mona
- Wander the gallery or take a Moorilla and Moo Brew Brewery tasting tour

*Overnight in Hobart*

## Day 7 – Hobart and Richmond

*Distance and drive time: 70 km – 1 hr 15 min*

- Drive to the summit of kunanyi/Mt Wellington and watch a spectacular sunrise
- Take a guided tour of Bonorong Wildlife Sanctuary
- Stop in at Richmond and explore its rich colonial history
- Pick up artisan cheese and chocolates at Coal River Farm

*Depart Hobart*
